# DATES TO NOTE — helpful dates to keep you and your student informed

**Monday, April 3** – Registration for summer and fall classes opened and continues through summer

**Monday, April 10** – The summer housing application opened and Bridge Week housing applications were sent to residential students.

Friday, April 21 – Bridge Week housing applications were due.

**Tuesday, April 25** – Summer housing assignments are sent via Widener email and on a rolling basis thereafter.

Friday, April 28 – Last day of spring classes.

Friday, April 28 – Spring fling, 1–5 p.m. Memorial Field.

Friday, April 28 – Late-night breakfast, 9–11 p.m. Pride Café.

**Monday, May 1** – Deadline to submit the FAFSA to be considered for Pennsylvania state grant funding for students enrolling in summer 2023, fall 2023 or spring of 2024. **Monday, May 1 through Friday, May 5** – Final exams. Students are expected to move out of the residence halls within 24 hours of their last finals.

**Friday, May 5** – Residence halls close at 6 p.m. Only students walking in graduation or staying for bridge housing may remain.

**Tuesday, May 9** – All grades are submitted to the registrar. Students can check final grades in Student Planning through myWidener.

Tuesday, May 9 - Thursday, May 11, Commencement ceremonies, Memorial Field.

**Friday, May 12** – Commencement ceremony severe weather makeup date if necessary, Memorial Field.

**Sunday, May 14** – 11 a.m.–2 p.m., Summer housing move-in, bridge housing transition.

Monday, May 15 – Summer undergraduate classes begin.

**Thursday, June 1** – Last day for returning students to add themselves to the waitlist for single rooms and apartment-style housing for the upcoming academic year.

**Friday, June 30** – Last date to submit a housing release through the housing portal to cancel for fall semester or the academic year for any reason with no financial penalty.

Monday, July 31 – Last date to submit a housing release through the housing portal to cancel for fall semester or the academic year for any reason with a \$250 cancellation fee.
